CHAPTER 1

INTRODUCTION

Introduction to Richland County Regional Planning Commission

Richland County Regional Planning Commission (RCRPC) and the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO)

The MPO for the Mansfield Urbanized Area is the Coordinating Committee of the Continuing Comprehensive Land Use and Transportation Study. The MPO is organized through the RCRPC, which operates under the provisions of Section 713.21 & 713.23 of the Ohio Revised Code.

In 1959, a group of Richland County community leaders saw the need for planning. They envisioned that the issues a regional planning agency could address would range from infrastructure to zoning. They wanted to deal with issues affecting the development of the region as a whole, or more than one political subdivision within the region, which do not begin and terminate within the boundaries of any single municipality.

The City of Mansfield and Richland County Commissioner's jointly created the RCRPC in 1959 to undertake this planning. The organization carries on today, still true to its original purpose -- most notably the ongoing focus on issues that affect the development of the Region as a whole.

In 1966 it was decided that the most appropriate existing agency in Richland County to perform the Comprehensive Land Use and Transportation Study was the Regional Planning Commission. However, due to the fact that there were conflicts in the rules and regulations governing membership on the RCRPC and membership on the Policy Body of the Comprehensive Land Use and Transportation Study, it was necessary that a separate autonomous body, the "Coordinating Committee", be formed to oversee this new transportation responsibility.

Regional Vision

Richland County will have a transportation system that meets the needs of the 21st Century. A truly multimodal system will operate to move people and goods safely and efficiently throughout Richland County.

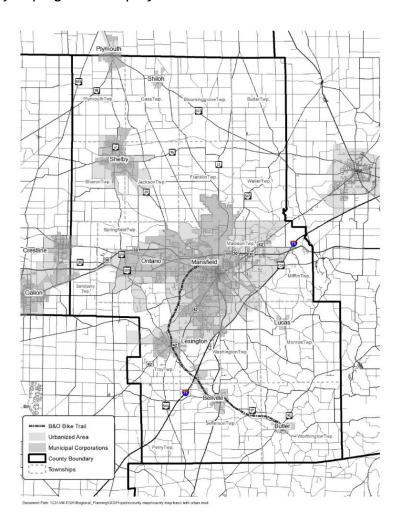
The development of Richland County will be supported by a framework of transportation options, with the goal of protecting physical, social and economic environments.

Mobility and access will be optimized by a balanced system of roadway networks, transit, rail freight, pedestrian, and bicycle modes.

There are five core functions of the RCRPC MPO:

- 1) <u>Establish a setting</u>: Establish and provide a fair and impartial setting for effective regional transportation related decision making in Richland County.
- 2) <u>Evaluate alternatives</u>: Evaluate transportation alternatives, scaled to the size and complexity of the region, to the nature of its transportation issues, and to the realistically available options, including funding resources.
- 3) <u>Maintain a Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP)</u>: Develop and update a long-range transportation plan for the area which spans a planning horizon of at least twenty (20) years. This plan should foster mobility and access for people and goods, efficient system performance and preservation, and improved quality of life.
- 4) <u>Develop a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP):</u> Develop a four (4) year project implementation program that is based on the long-range transportation plan, and designed to serve the area's goals, using spending, regulating, operating, management, and financial tools.
- 5) <u>Involve the Public</u>: Ensure that the general public, and all of the significantly affected sub-groups, have the opportunity to be actively involved in the core functions that are listed above

The Richland County Regional Planning Commission employs a staff of professionals to undertake a variety of programs and projects.



Primary Responsibilities of Richland County Regional Planning Commission

MPOs, such as Richland County Regional Planning Commission are responsible for conducting an array of transportation planning activities, providing technical services and distributing transportation planning and project funding for their member communities and agencies, as established in <u>23 CFR 450 Subpart C</u>. MPOs are responsible for creating several key recurring planning documents. These required planning documents include:

- A multimodal, long-range transportation plan (LRTP) for the region
- A biennial transportation improvement program (TIP)
- An annual unified planning work program (UPWP)

TIP Overview

The TIP is a comprehensive and financially constrained listing of regional transportation projects and services that are scheduled for some phase of implementation within the four-year TIP period. The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) also known as the "Bipartisan Infrastructure Law" (BIL) was signed into law November 2021. The IIJA continues the metropolitan planning process and a Continuous, Comprehensive, and Cooperative (3C) framework for making transportation investment decisions in metropolitan areas. The projects identified in this TIP were selected utilizing this 3C planning process in cooperation with Richland County Regional Planning Commission, USDOT, the State of Ohio, and local entities, and are in alignment with the goals of the RCRPC long range plan titled "Direction Looking Forward 2045". The projects have funding commitments from a variety of federal, state and local sources. The program of projects maintains a balance of local and regional needs and includes projects from all modes of transportation including highways, public transportation, bicycles and pedestrians.

The development of the TIP is the responsibility of Richland County Regional Planning Commission, which is the designated MPO for Richland County. The TIP is developed on a biennial basis in conjunction with the development of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Once the TIP is adopted by the Coordinating Committee, it is then submitted to ODOT and U.S. DOT for approval and inclusion by reference into Ohio's STIP.

Consistency with the Long-Range Transportation Plan

Richland County Regional Planning Commission completed its long-range transportation plan (LRTP) titled "Direction Looking Forward 2045" in 2020. These long-range plans are federally required to cover a minimum 20-year time horizon and must analyze all transportation needs over that time period, including roadway, bridge, transit, and non-motorized modes of travel. https://www.rcrpc.org/_files/ugd/1b25ec_8e69acb73e4b40099b747d0e637c1129.pdf (appendix A)

The goals, objectives and strategies stated in the long-range transportation plan establish Richland County Regional Planning Commission's overall approach to the prioritization of transportation projects and investments. These goals and their descriptions are included below in Table 1.

PERFORMANCE BASED PLANNING AND PROGRAMMING

Introduction to Transportation Performance Management

FHWA and FTA have developed a series of performance measures that every state must monitor to determine how effectively their transportation investments are advancing the national performance goals (23 CFR 490). As reaffirmed in the BiPartisan Infrastructure bill, Statewide transportation targets have been established for each of these performance metrics. The targets were established by a coordinated effort between ODOT and the MPOs.

Richland County Regional Planning Commission has approved supporting ODOT in achieving the State Wide Performance Measure Targets.

The following is information on the federally required transportation measures applicable to the RCRPC. Richland County Regional Planning Commission works with ODOT and other local transportation partners to ensure regional transportation projects are selected to effectively address the transportation performance measures.

PM1: Safety Performance Measures

23 CFR 490.207 requires states to establish five safety performance measures and set targets for those measures to demonstrate fatal and serious injury reductions on all public roads. The figure below shows the safety performance measures, baselines, and targets. These measures are evaluated on a 5-year rolling average.

AIR QUALITY CONFORMITY

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA) monitors and sets National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for several transportation-related pollutants. The agency is responsible for determining whether each county in the United States is in attainment or non-attainment for each of those pollutants. Currently in Ohio, the pollutants include nitrogen oxide (NOx), volatile organic compounds (VOC) and particulate matter 2.5 micrometers or smaller in size (PM^{2.5}).

The Richland County Study Area is considered to be an attainment area under the present CleanAir Act and meets the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for ozone, carbon monoxide, or particulate matter. As such we are not subject to transportation conformity requirements. However, we feel that our planning program and improvement program lends itself to minimizing increases in emissions and maintaining the attainment status. Furthermore, the program lends itself to being expanded and redirected towards efforts related to mitigation should Richland County's status change.

ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE ANALYSIS

Environmental Justice (EJ) requirements "Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations". EJ requires all federally funded agencies, including Richland County Regional Planning Commission, to identify and address disproportionately high and adverse human health or environmental effects of their actions on minority and low-income populations, to the greatest extent practicable and permitted by law. Agencies must also develop strategies to address any disproportionate and adverse impacts that are brought to light.

There are three fundamental environmental justice principles:

- 1. Avoid, minimize, or mitigate disproportionately high and adverse human health and environmental effects, including social and economic effects, on minority populations and low-income populations.
- 2. Ensure the full and fair participation of all potentially affected communities in the transportation decision-making process.
- 3. Prevent denial of, reduction in, or significant delay in the receipt of benefits by minority and low-income populations.

Richland County Regional Planning Commission has adopted the following strategies to integrate EJ into the agency's transportation planning strategy:

The process of picking stakeholders for a project will be tactfully done with a specific emphasis on getting members of the affected population and underserved populations. Underserved populations typically refer to racial and ethnic minorities, disabled, or people living in poverty. Other interested parties are businesses, transportation providers, or organizations with specific transportation needs. RCRPC will maintain an up-to-date database of contacts to facilitate stakeholder engagement.

Outreach/Inclusion

RCRPC will keep in mind ways to reach out and get involvement from underserved populations. This includes having a Language Assistance Plan and informing staff on helping people with a language barrier participate in involvement. RCRPC will also hold meetings in locations with transit access, offer multiple times for public involvement, plus provide on-line access to involve the public who cannot attend in-person public meetings but want to participate in public involvement.

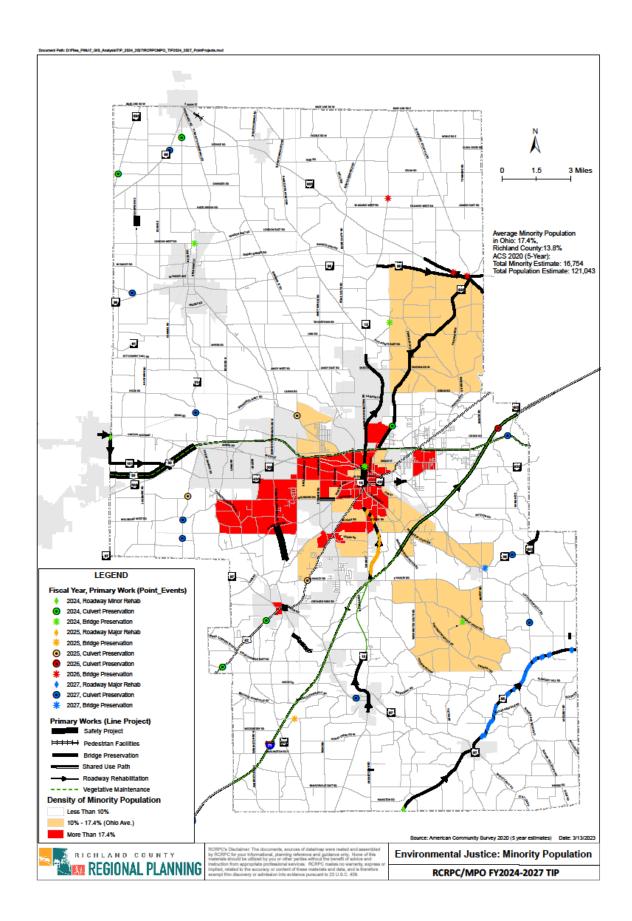

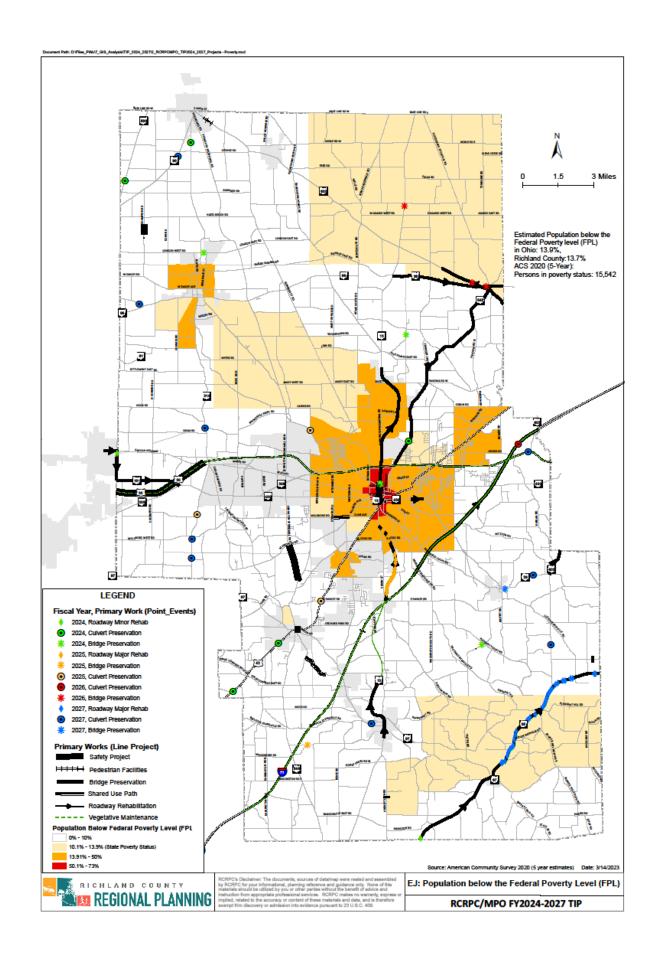

TITLE VI AND ADA COMPLIANCE

Title VI

Richland County Regional Planning Commission acknowledges the importance of ensuring that everyone has the opportunity to be involved in the region's transportation planning process, regardless of their background or abilities. Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 states that "No person in the United States shall, on the ground of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance". As a recipient of federal funding and as required by Title VI, Richland County Regional Planning Commission has adopted the following non-discrimination policy:

Richland County Regional Planning Commission Title VI Non Discrimination Policy Statement To effectuate Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, during the performance of its work as a Regional Planning Commission and as the MPO for the Mansfield - Richland County area, the following shall be the policy of the Richland County Regional Planning Commission (hereafter RCRPC): RCRPC assures that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, as provided by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987 (PL 100.259), be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any agency-sponsored program or activity.

Any person who believes that he or she has been excluded from participation in or has been denied the benefits or services of any program administered by Richland County Regional Planning Commission, on the basis of race, color, national origin, gender, age, disability or income status may file a complaint of discrimination under Title VI, other non-discrimination statutes. A complaint may be filed directly with Richland County Regional Planning Commission, the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT), the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) or the Federal Transit Administration (FTA).  civic and community associations, special Interest groups, transportation system users,
 providers of public and private transit services, providers of freight /shipping services,
 representatives of pedestrian/bicycle users and transportation facilities
 representatives of the disabled populations, Environmental Justice (EJ) populations,
 Limited English Proficiency (LEP).

Richland County Regional Planning Commission embraces diversity and inclusivity and provides an environment of non-discrimination. The SFY 2026 - 2029 TIP planning process was conducted with these important considerations in mind and is compliant with all Title VI regulations and requirements.

ADA

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) prohibits discrimination based on disability and requires all public agencies to provide safe, equal access to their programs, activities and facilities. Richland County Regional Planning Commission values the input of all the region's residents into the transportation planning process, and took the following measures to ensure that everyone, regardless of their abilities, could access and engage in the SFY 2026 - 2029 TIP planning process:

RCRPC has all of their public meetings in locations that meet the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. Most meetings take place at the RCRPC Office which is ADA compliant, however if for any reason the public involvement is moved then RCRPC will chose a locations that accommodates the disabled population. ADA compliant parking and transit facilities are available, as well as accommodations for the visually or hearing impaired

Richland County Regional Planning Commission carefully considered the needs of all of our region's residents throughout the SFY 2026 - 2029 TIP planning process, meeting or exceeding all ADA requirements.

PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

As the primary near-term project implementation document for the Richland County Regional Planning Commission region, it is imperative that all of the region's stakeholders have the opportunity to engage in and provide their input into the TIP development process. As required by federal regulation (23 CFR 450.316), Richland County Regional Planning Commission has adopted a Public Involvement Plan. This document details RCRPC public involvement process for all of its principle duties, including the development of the TIP document, which was developed in a manner consistent with the Richland County Regional Planning Commission public participation plan. Representatives from RCRPC will be on hand to answer any questions and to provide clarification on the draft TIP.

As per the RCRPC Public Involvement Plan notifications will be done through press releases, email and social media. The document and comment areas will be available on www.rcrpc.org. Physical copies of the TIP and comment sheets will also be made available to the public.

Comments will be responded to and reported in the final TIP document as Appendix D.

- Have an air quality status of "Exempt"
- Have a negligible environmental impact
- Will not add capacity to the existing system
- Have a total project cost below \$30 million

Individual Projects

This section provides the project lists of the individual highway and transit projects scheduled for some phase of implementation during the SFY 2026 - 2029 TIP period.

All of the projects detailed in this section are consistent with the Richland County Regional Planning Commission long-range transportation plan, [Direction Looking Forward 2045].

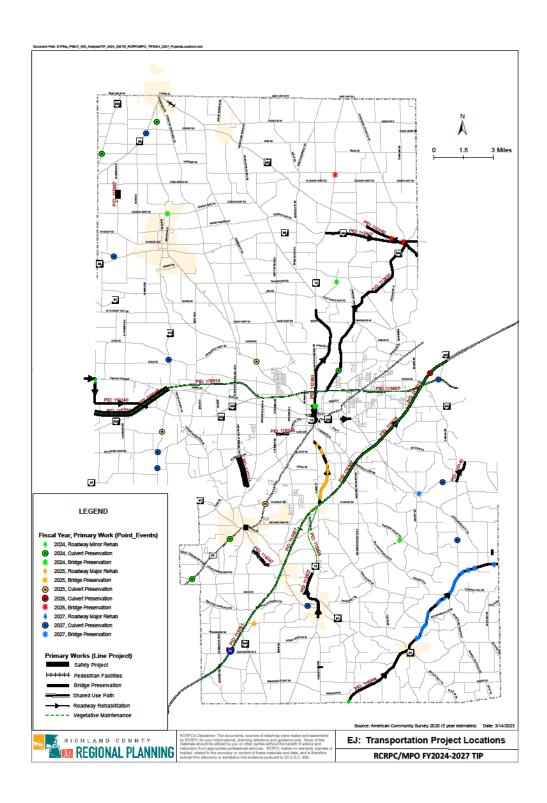

Chapter 9

FISCAL CONSTRAINT ANALYSIS

For a project to be included in the TIP, per federal regulations, reasonable fiscal constraint must be maintained. Fiscal constraint is achieved by keeping estimated transportation improvements within reasonably anticipated budgets. Richland County Regional Planning Commission affirms that its SFY 2026 - 2029 TIP meets all fiscal constraint requirements. The ODOT STIP addresses the fiscal constraint for projects included in the TIP that are financed with ODOT controlled funding sources.

Background

As the federally designated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for Richland County, Per Federal regulations, the MPO Richland County Regional Planning Commission (RCRPC) is responsible for developing and maintaining the region's Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) that guides the transportation decision making and funding decisions for the next 25 years.

A key step in developing and updating the Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) is to identify a list of priority transportation projects for the Richland County Transportation Study Area. The development of this project list is a federal requirement and includes all projects that intend to use federal funding sources or are otherwise considered regionally significant.

This planning process is undertaken by RCRPC transportation staff every five years and includes a 25-year planning horizon, in this case 2025 - 2050. The 2025-2050 LRTP is scheduled for completion and approval by the Commission in early 2025.

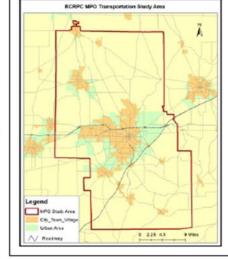
Jurisdictions and transportation agencies are eligible to nominate transportation projects for consideration in the LRTP. Projects must be located within the RCRPC

Transportation Planning Study Area. Please see the map at right for the boundary of the MPO Transportation Study Area.

Eligible project types include construction of new roadways, improvements to existing roadways, transit projects, bicycle and pedestrian facilities, and other transportation improvements as allowed by federal law and regulations. Any roadway projects are required to have a current or future functional classification as a Federal Aid Urban (FAU) route: Minor Collector and above. Current roadway classifications can be found on ODOT's interactive map: Roadway Functional Classification Map

Funds will not be distributed as a result of this solicitation. However, there are several reasons to nominate projects for the LRTP:

- Identifying regional transportation priorities will direct the investment of federal funds.
- Being listed in the LRTP will help communicate information to the public about projects planned for our region.
- 3. For federal transportation funding programs, only projects included in the LRTP are eligible for funds.
- 4. For some federal funding programs, projects receive extra consideration if they are included in the LRTP.
